An Easy Way to Create Intelligence Agents

The CIA avoids putting actual agents in the field, which means accepting risks, which the CIA bureaucracy is afraid to do. As a result, the CIA will never penetrate terrorist organizations. They say that it is impossible. But if a twenty-year-old Islamic convert from California, John Walker Lindh, was able to join the Taliban, why is it that the CIA did not have a single agent or case officer working inside Afghanistan, Pakistan, Iraq or Syria, let alone in the Taliban, or in al Qaeda?

"You couldn't get anybody in Islamabad to run a source into Afghanistan," CIA insiders reported before 9-11. Clintonista CIA Director Tenet claimed after the 9-11 attacks that the CIA had "a huge asset base" in Afghanistan. He lied. Actually if there were any CIA sources, it was more likely one or two people.

Elsewhere in the region, things were just as bad. In the early 1990s, the CIA did not have a single agent inside Iraq. "I would know because I was head of Iraqi operations for a while," a former CIA supervisor admitted. "We had no agents in Iraq. We had fought in a war three years before with Iraq. We didn't have anybody on the ground.

Occasionally somebody would go in from Amman. But nothing you could call a controlled, paid, vetted source in Iraq."

Many citizens have done what the CIA and FBI cannot do. For years before 9-11 and since then, at least two hundred native born "Americans" (they don't deserve to be called Americans) of all races, have journeyed to Pakistan and joined muslim terrorist groups there. The majority cannot speak any muslim dialects and are mostly ignorant about the real "character" of Islam. Their process for getting inside muslim terrorism is very easy. First, they begin going to local treasonous Islamic mosques within the USA. They humbly ask to become a muslim and learn the language. After six months to a year or so of Islamic instruction within the many US mosques, they tell their local mullah that they want to join the glorious "muslim freedom fighters," in the Middle East. Then, they undergo a short preliminary course in terrorism conducted at the mosque by the local "patriotic American muslim clerics." After that, the new terrorists journey to a terrorist training center overseas and then on to participation in a muslim terrorist organization.

Untrained Americans of all ages and races, most with average or below average intelligence (thus perfect terrorist material) easily "penetrate" muslim terrorism. Yet, America's CIA cannot or will not penetrate muslim terrorist organizations. America's FBI cannot or will not penetrate muslim terrorist organizations.

The CIA claims that it takes them 7 years to train an intelligence agent capable of penetrating muslim terrorist groups. That too is a lie, since hundreds of untrained American traitors have "penetrated" muslim terrorist groups.

If the CIA was a pro-American agency, it could easily recruit patriotic Americans of all ages to follow the process outlined above. The penetration of muslim terrorism can be successfully achieved through a deniable process. However, the CIA would have to bring in British and Israeli agent handlers to manage a spy net, since the CIA has never learned to manage intelligence agents.

Anyone with a lick of sense must realize that both the CIA and FBI are penetrated by muslim terrorist moles. Therefore, it would be suicide to work for them as a deep penetration agent inside muslim terrorism. The CIA and FBI are not trusted for good reason. Until America forms new, trustworthy intelligence agencies, muslim terrorism will rule.

Instead of field agents, lawyers are the pervasive force inside the CIA, as they are in any other Washington bureaucracy. Lawyers accompany agents in the field to make sure the CIA won't be sued for their actions, and to supervise political correctness.

Tenet offered one explanation for the CIA's shortcomings. He said the problem was that U.S. intelligence cannot act unilaterally but must work with "countries out there who have often deflected us, or have not recognized there was a terrorism problem, who didn't help us solve problems that we could not solve simply on our own."

The fact is that the CIA is next to useless if it doesn't penetrate terrorist organizations with its own agents, instead of relying on foreign liaison services or defectors. Without having a unilateral capability to get inside a terrorist group, there can be no disrupting its activities.

A former senior Near East Division operative says, "The CIA doesn't have a single truly qualified Arabic-speaking officer of Middle Eastern background who can play a believable Muslim fundamentalist who would volunteer to spend years of his life with shitty food and no women in the mountains of Afghanistan. For Christ's sake, most case officers live in the suburbs of Virginia. We don't do that kind of thing." A younger case officer boils the problem down even further: "Operations that include diarrhea as a way of life don't happen." The Agency's risk-averse, bureaucratic nature—which mirrors, of course, the growing physical risk-aversion of American leftist elites—has only gotten worse.

The US embassy in Islamabad (Pakistan) is a fortress surrounded by roadblocks, Pakistani soldiers, and walls topped with security cameras and razor wire. Essentially, life

within the Westernized, high-walled cantonment area is life inside a monastery of the indolent. Places where US diplomats are unlikely to bump into fundamentalists are preferred CIA hangouts. Individual officers may venture out, but their curiosity isn't encouraged or rewarded. Unless one of bin Ladin's foot soldiers walks through the door of a US consulate or embassy, the odds that a CIA counter terrorist officer will ever see one are extremely poor.
